# RENOVATION AND CAPITAL CAMPAIGN UPDATE

The new stone cross has been put in place. Bishop Hying will be coming to bless the new steel cross soon. The masons are continuing working on repairing and replacing the stone on the spire. The storm protection company is working on putting lightening protection up for the Church. The area around the kitchen door was worked on.

The Capital Campaign is moving along. So far \$1,080,400.00 has been pledged. As you can see we are so close but are still short of our of goal of raising 1.2 million needed to complete our renovation. Jerry or the Parish as soon as possible. If you have already made a pledge and are able to pay it all now instead of over a three to five year period please consider doing so. We are able to have half the capacity of the Church attend Mass or 150 individuals.


PLEASE respect the six foot "social distancing" rules. We have blocked off every other pew to aid with the rules.

# WEARING MASKS BY THE FAITHFUL

In accord with current public health recommendations, the faithful are strongly encouraged to wear cloth face coverings when in public, including when they come to church. Persons should refrain from directly confronting individuals who are not wearing masks, since they may suffer from a condition, such as asthma, that makes it prohibitively difficult to wear a mask. If a civil county mandates the wearing of masks in public, including in religious settings, then the wearing of masks by the faithful in that county at a religious service is mandatory only in that county, to the extent of the civil mandates for that county.

**Glory be** to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Sprit. As it was in the beginning, is now and ever shall be, world without end. AMEN
