CATHOLIC WOMEN'S SPIRITUAL DAY

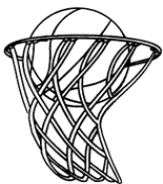

CCW MEETING MINUTES
JANUARY 5, 2020

CCW President, Melissa Schmitt, called the meeting to order and invited all present to start the meeting with a prayer.

Fr. Jerry informed the group that Most Reverend Bishop Donald Hying will visit St. Norbert on Sunday, February 2, 2020 for the 8:00am Mass. Then he will go to Divine Mercy and attend the 10:30am Mass there. Fr. Jerry asked the CCW ladies if they would be willing to help organize some food for a small get together after the Mass in the Church Hall. Fr. Jerry also said that the Renovation Committee met with three General Contractors. A decision should be made this week as to who the Parish is hiring and the work should begin this spring. He also mentioned that fundraising is moving on.

CCW Secretary, Juanita Wipperfurth, read the minutes from the December 8, 2019 meeting. No changes were made to the minutes and they were approved as read. It was noted that our Sister Parish is Santo Domingo in Costa Rica; which was the mission that Fr. Rudy was located at.

CCW Treasurer, Jeanne Walsh, shared that she deposited money for: the wreath sale, vanilla sales, cookbook sales, a check from the Fall Harvest Breakfast, and the Christmas Flowers. She paid: the NCCW dues, the 100 year Anniversary of the CCW banner, Religious Education salaries, Mass stipends for Christmas, Gift Certificates and other gifts for Christmas, Wreath sale expenses, and the last of the invoices for the Fall Harvest Breakfast.

Thank you cards from Jim and Billie Frey, Bill Alt, Silvanna Navarro, Bernice Marx and Fr. Meier were shared. Melissa also shared a card and box of chocolates the CCW received from the Consecrated Ladies. Lucy Kippley, Judy Endres and Juanita volunteered to measure the tables to see what size table clothes we need to purchase after the meeting.

The \$500 donation to the Food Pantry was sent.

Juanita brought along a pledge form for the Capital Campaign. At the December meeting it was decided to pledge \$1,000 for five years for a total of \$5,000 to the Capital Campaign. Decided to make the donation in January this year and the next four years.

Melissa sent the money and order form in for the CCW 100 year banner.

A fresh kitchen supply list has been posted.

We will take down the Christmas decorations in the Hall after the 8:00am Mass on Sunday, January 12.

We will look into getting the Church Hall cleaned later in the year because of the renovation and how it looks.

Melissa will post the Meals on Wheels sign up sheets in the back of Church in the next week or two.

Jeanne volunteered to take the Baby Jesus shower to the Woman's Care Center in Madison. Thank you Jeanne.

Both co-chairs for the Pork Chop Dinner declined. Michelle Ziegler and Juanita volunteered to co-chairs.

The Brat Stand dates are June 19 and 20 Melissa is waiting on confirmation from Piggly Wiggly.

The Group Sign Up Sheets need to be organized and put out in the back of Church. A discussion was had as to whether we need to restructure the Group Lists for the future since it is hard to get volunteers to help. Michelle Ziegler offered to look into a Signs by Caitlin Fundraiser.

St. Norbert's CCW will host the Fall Vicariate Meeting. Melissa was contacted to switch and instead host this Spring but declined and will keep the Fall meeting. Melissa will look into getting the Bishop as a speaker. A date will be set based on the Bishop's availability.

The Church Cleaning folder is ready and will be given to the co-chairs.

A discussion was had about posting a trifold display to show what the CCW does and supports in our Parish as part of the 100 year celebration.

The MDCCW Convention is June 18. The NCCW Convention is in Washington D.C. August 26 - 29.

The next meeting will be Sunday, February 9 after the 8:00am Mass.
