Cemetery Committee Meeting February 27, 2020

Father Jerry began with a short prayer.

The minutes of the March 7, 2019 meeting were read and approved without any changes.

Harriett shared the financial report from March 2019 – Present

Old Business:

1. Converting the cemetery records to a digital format - Dave Endres, Endres Reporting Solutions LLC,

successfully created a digital database of the cemetery records. Dave did an incredible job with this huge undertaking; the database is currently in use and working very well! The committee thanks Dave for all the time and effort that went into creating the database and providing the ability to access and preserve the cemetery records.

- 2. Available plots Currently there are 9 double plots and 6 single plots available in the original cemetery
 - boundary.
- 3. Power washing monument Spellman Monument is scheduled in spring 2020 to perform the work.
- 4. Trees Leidig Tree Service removed the large pine tree and stump along CTH Y.
- 5. New driveway Derrick will talk with the asphalt company working on CTH Y this summer to obtain recommendations/prices to repair the driveway.

New Business:

- 1. Cleaning up the area for extension of cemetery several small trees and brush are emerging at the north end of the cemetery and should be cleaned up. Paul recommended that the Knights of Columbus could possibly perform some of the cleanup as a volunteer project, Paul will discuss with them. Father Jerry agreed that this should be a parish project, several parishioners were mentioned as possibly having equipment that could be utilized for the cleanup.
- 2. Anchor Bank has been acquired by Old National Bank. Old National Bank is going to close the Waunakee branch. Currently, two CD's will be maturing in March and the funds will be transferred to a local bank, Juanita will contact the local banks.
- 3. Mowing the cemetery. The Schaafs will not be mowing this summer. New custodian, Mike Haight says he can do both the church and the cemetery. The cemetery committee will reimburse the Parish for Mike's time spent mowing and maintaining the cemetery.
- 4. New easement papers are needed. The heading will be changed on the back to provide signature spaces for the current priest and cemetery superintendent. Also, perpetual care language will be included in the easement document reflecting rule changes enacted in 2019.

Rules and Regulations of St. Norbert's Catholic Cemetery Roxbury, Wisconsin Effective: February 27, 2020

Voted, approved and executed by St. Norbert Cemetery Committee

Reasons:

Safety of the caretaker

Safety of the equipment (i.e. lawnmower)

Safety of visitors

Overall look and maintenance of the cemetery

- 1. Artificial flowers or wreaths are not allowed from April 1 November 1.
- 2. Flowers or plants are only allowed one foot from the tombstone. Any planted flower or plant to be maintained by the family.
- 3. No trees or shrubs will be allowed.
- 4. Any flowers or weeds that have been removed from the gravesite by a family member or visitor must be taken from the cemetery grounds.
- 5. Only one (1) shepherd hook is allowed by each tombstone.
- 6. Rocks and any kind of breakable glass or figurines that are easily knocked over are prohibited.
- 7. Edging of any type is prohibited.
- 8. Any gravesite not maintained properly and according to St. Norbert Cemetery Rules and Regulations will be handled accordingly:
 - A. The family or surviving spouse will be notified by the Superintendent by letter. A copy of the letter will be kept on file with the Cemetery records.
 - B. The family will have a reasonable time frame of no more than eight weeks, depending on season to rectify the problem.
 - C. If the problem persists or is not handled properly the Cemetery Committee will handle the situation and see that the gravesite is maintained in accordance to the St. Norbert's Cemetery Rules and Regulations.
- 9. The size of tombstones shall be:
 - A. Single plot no wider than 36 inches
 - B. Double plot no wider than 72 inches
- 10. Diocese of Madison requests that all tombstones have some kind of Catholic marking such as cross, rosary, etc.; St. Norbert's Cemetery Committee supports that request.
- 11.Only parishioners of St. Norbert's are allowed to purchase a plot. Once a plot is purchased by a parishioner if someone from the family, either parishioner or non-parishioner, wants to have their cremains buried on the site on top of the existing grave they must have a written letter from the surviving spouse or if there is no surviving spouse then all siblings must approve of this in writing. With the proper signed permission on file three (3) cremains on each side of the gravesite will be allowed, for a total not to exceed six (6).
- 12. Urns that will be buried on an existing gravesite may have a marker. Markers can measure no more than Twelve (12) inches wide by eighteen (18) inches long. All markers must be level with the ground, no portion will be allowed to protrude above ground level.
- 13. All burials, cremations or non-cremations, MUST be approved by the Cemetery Superintendent and a record of the burial will be made in the Parish Sacramental Record. Unauthorized burials are prohibited.
- 14. If anyone has an extra plot they are encouraged to sell it back to the St. Norbert Cemetery for the price they originally paid. Or they may sell it to a family member, who is a parishioner of St. Norbert's Parish, with written permission from the surviving spouse or if no surviving spouse from all surviving siblings.
- 15. Plot owners that are current Non Parishioners will pay a one time \$250 Perpetual Care Fee at the time of burial.
- 16. The Rules and Regulations are subject to change at the discretion of the St. Norbert's Cemetery Committee.

CEMETERY PRICING LIST

CREMATION:

\$350 per plot

\$700/ two plots

\$125/if buried on an existing plot

\$125 excavation fee to place a cremation

\$250 Perpetual Care for non-parishioners

Regular sized stone is allowed for the person purchasing the plot for cremation.

Any cremations added to a plot their stones must be level with the ground and be no bigger than 12 inches x 18 inches.

Only three (3) cremations can be buried per plot.

PLOTS:

Each plot is 4.5 feet wide (54 inches)

\$350/per plot

\$700/ two plots (9 feet/108 inches wide)

\$250 Perpetual Care for non-parishioners

\$125 excavation fee to place any cremation on an existing plot.

Only three (3) cremations allowed on each plot in addition to vault (casket).

^{*} The size of a Military stone is dictated by the branch of the military they were in.
