Effective Friday, September 10, 2021 at 12:01am, Public Health Madison & Dane County issued [Face Covering Emergency Order #2 PDF](#). The Order is nearly identical to the current face covering order which requires that everyone age 2 and older wear a face covering or mask when in in any enclosed building where other people, except for members of the person's own household or living unit, could be present.
