RENOVATION AND CAPITAL CAMPAIGN UPDATE

The steel cross is back on top of the spire. Bishop Hying will be coming to bless it. The roof is almost done. The masons are continuing working on repairing and replacing the stone on the spire. The storm protection company is working on putting lightening protection up for the Church. The area around the kitchen door is being worked on.

The Capital Campaign is moving along. So far \$1,080,400.00 has been pledged. As you can see we are so close but are still short of our of goal of raising 1.2 million needed to complete our renovation. If you would like a virtual visit or a phone call to discuss your pledge please contact Fr. Jerry or Juanita to schedule a time. If you already have a pledge form please return it to Fr. Jerry or the Parish as soon as possible. If you have already made a pledge and are able to pay it all now instead of over a three to five year period please consider doing so. A very special thank you to everyone who has already pledged to the Capital Campaign.

COVID-19 INFORMATION

We are able to have half the capacity of the Church attend Mass or 150 individuals.

PLEASE respect the six foot "social distancing" rules. We have blocked off every other pew to aid with the rules.

Please remember that we have disinfectant spray and paper towels at each entrance; parishioners are asked to spray and wipe their pews before and after use.

As of July 13 Dane County requires masks to be worn in all public places. We have donated masks available at all entrances. Holy Communion may be received in the hand or on the tongue. No wearing of gloves for distribution and reception of Holy Communion.

WEARING MASKS BY THE FAITHFUL

RENOVATION COMMITTEE MEETING Wednesday, August 26, 2020

6:00pm Via Google Meet

Attended by: Fr. Jerry, Nick Ballweg, Mark Maier, Paul Merline, Ed Breunig, Tom Howard, and Juanita Wipperfurth

Fr. Jerry started the meeting with a prayer.

Fr. Jerry gave on update on work completed. The steel cross has been removed. The rotten wood under the steel has been removed and replaced. The concrete cross was removed. The roof is starting to get shingles put on. The stones on the spire were cleaned and assessed. They are now getting worked on.

Fr. Jerry shared some work that previously had not been noticed until they started removing and cleaning. Even with the additional discoveries because of the built in contingencies the project is still under the \$1,200,000.00 budget.

Nick will check to see if Endres Manufacturing has some steel that would work to replace the metal cross. Fr. Jerry will check to see if they already started on the cross before Nick proceeds.

Tom has a cousin that would be willing to carve a new stone cross at a significate savings. Cost would be \$1,300. Renovation Committee approved asking him to carve the cross at a cost of \$1,300.

Additional masonry repairs were discovered. Point was made that we would not be doing this extensive of a repair again and Fr. Jerry should have them fix the problems on the spire. If need be we can do the kitchen wall at a later date.

To date we have pledged amounts of \$956,000.00 towards our \$1.2 million goal. Still need \$250,000.

Mark asked Fr. Jerry to remind the Foreman, Matt, about checking the insulating about the altar. Paul discussed the pros and cons of putting together a thermometer to show how much we need to raise yet

Juanita is waiting on a order of more parish letterhead to send out mailings to people who have contributed to the parish in the past.

Paul commended Fr. Jerry and the Renovation committee on all their hard work fundraising so far. He pointed out that we are now in the "grind it out stage." Committee members are asked to contact parishioners on their list to follow up now that the mailing has been sent. We may have to go back to original donors to see if they can give even more. Or we can think about having a special collection each month for unforeseeable future to pay off any loan we have to take on. Paul also mentioned that he is more than happy to accompany anyone who wants to meet face to face.
